CARLA'S CORNER

Here is a personal story about Atlanta Junior Bridge (AJB). A year ago, after reading about AJB and their success, I went to their website and checked out the teachers who were giving bridge camps last summer.

Finding Carolyn Eckert, who had had great success teaching bridge to 4th and 5th graders, I determined she was my choice to teach my granddaughter, Sarah Manning (11 yrs). Sarah lives in Pensacola, but unfortunately, had a softball tournament during the only week Carolyn was teaching. So, with Carolyn's permission, my husband and I went to Atlanta to monitor the camp that week.

She gave us great teaching tools, and we came back and asked our granddaughter and her friend, Sarah Carl of Orange Beach, AL, if they would like to take bridge lessons. Her friend was very ready; my granddaughter was also (as long as the pizza bribes were present). After approximately ten lessons during the school year, we ventured off to the Youth North American Bridge Championships in Atlanta this July. Carolyn taught them and two of her students two hours the Monday before the tournament began, and three hours on Tuesday by themselves. She and I were permitted to play with each of them at a local club beginners' game on Wednesday, their first-ever real game. No points were given since the adults were ineligible to play at that level. Carolyn emphasized bridge etiquette and wrote down the good things they did as well as areas for improvement.

She complimented the girls on their efforts, and she and I had a private discussion regarding future things on which to work, always emphasizing the positive. It's all about fun, fun, fun!! Catch them doing something right! The two Sarahs played one session each day Thursday through Sunday at the tournament, and came home with their first masterpoints. I was able to sit beside them all four days helping them score and keeping things moving at the table, no instruction, of course. Play Hard, Play Well!

- US Team Trials

At the Palm Beach Regional this year, Florida also hosted the USBF Team Trials. The 2008 Team Trials pitted America's best players against each other for the right to represent the US at the World Mind Games taking place alongside the Olympics in China this fall.

I had played in the Regional pairs events early in the week, but as the week progressed and some of my friends were eliminated from the Team Trials, we found that we had a collection of talented young players to build a team. Our team became **Jenni and Tom Carmichael, Joel Wooldridge, Jacob Morgan**, and me. It had been a long week for the players that were in the team trials and we were all just ready to have some fun, so we decided to cut for partners each time and played with very few agreements.

I played the following hand with Joel Wooldridge along the way to our win in the bracket one KO. The play contains a lot of interesting principles of control and timing, and resulted in a 10 IMP win for our team. See how you do.

None Vulnerable, Dealer: South, IMPs

My jump to 4♥ was aggressive, but since I was a passed hand and we had some gadgets available to show values in this auction, partner knew that I didn't have a great hand. I was just taking a shot at making 4♥. Joel judged well to pass even with all his extra values.

Lead: ♠J
Plan your play!

At IMPs it is important to remember that our first goal is to make our contract. Don't worry much about overtricks. So our goal is to get to 10 tricks. If we score five trump tricks from hand, one ♠, two ♦, one ♣, and one ♣ ruff in the dummy, we will make our contract. In order to accomplish this, we need to ruff a ♣ in dummy early in the hand. The only other potential problem is a 4-0 trump break, but we can still overcome that if we time everything just right.

At trick one I won the ♠A and immediately led the ♣Q from the dummy.

1: ♠J A x x (+1)
2: ♣Q A x x (-1)

Next, I ruffed the ♠ return and then tested trump.

3: ♠Q ♥x ♠x ♠x (+2)
4: ♥x ♠x ♥A ♥x (+3)

Now I cashed a ♣, ruffed a ♣, and then cashed the top two ♦.

5: ♣x x K x (+4)
6: ♣x ♣x ♥x ♣x (+5)
7: ♦A x x x (+6)
8: ♦K x x x (+7)

Now we have come to the important part of the play. Since trump are 4-0,

I need to shorten my trump to the same length as RHO – so I ruffed a ♠.

9: ♠x ♣x ♥x ♠x (+8)

This was the end position:

I exited with my losing ♦ and now I had to score one of my small trump and one of the top honors ♥Q or ♥J. Just making!

Molly liked the texture of her clubs, so she bid one club. "Three spades," cried Joe. "Double?" queried Mildred.

At this point, not wishing to alleviate any possible confusion, neither gentleman allowed his eyes to wander to the ladies' convention cards. Joe's partner passed.

Molly was really troubled. She squirmed. Someone had told her that she should not look at her convention card during the auction and she could not for the life of her remember to what level they played their new gadget, the one that made a double something else.

Joe stared at Molly, just daring her to look at her card. Molly decided to play it straight. With real resolve she said "Excuse me" and walked over to the director. She looked up into his eyes and explained that she wanted to do the right thing.

"Could you please tell me what I should do?" "If you do not remember what you are playing, do not alert what it only might be," said the director, "and do only what your hand indicates." Molly went back to the table, thanked all for waiting and considered her cards.

She glanced at Joe on her left. Well, he went down at only two spades on the last hand, she thought, this time he is at the three level and if Mildred wants to penalize this contract, I, with my good clubs and three trumps, can certainly be helpful. That's what she thought, "Pass" is what she said.

The cards were not favorably placed for the former IRS agent and well as he played, he had to concede six tricks.

Though he probably knew the laws well enough to know that no relief was available, he did call the director to voice his frustration and complain about "these people" who don't know when to alert or what they are playing.

The director listened dutifully if not sympathetically.

Next time we meet them, we'll see board #15, the piece de resistance.

OPENING LEADS AGAINST NO TRUMP CONTRACTS

AGAINST 3 NO TRUMP CONTRACTS

When the auction goes 1NT - 3NT you must decide which suit to lead and which card to play without much help from the bidding. We start with the principle that there are 40 high card points in the deck. You can count them yourself, AKQJ equals 10 and times four suits is 40. When the auction is 1NT, 3NT, neither person has indicated a long suit or a slam going hand. You can therefore estimate that the high-card strength held by the declarer is about 26. Subtracting this from 40 leaves 14 for the defensive side. Subtract your own points from the 14 that remain and you will know how many your partner has. Keep this number in mind as the play continues and adjust the balance when your partner plays high cards. You will then know how many points (honors) he has left.

If the bulk of the defensive points are held by you, you may have enough to set up your own long suit. In this case you make the aggressive lead of leading fourth down from your longest and strongest unless the suit is headed by an honor sequence. Against a NT contract you must have **three** in a row to lead a sequence. (Whereas in suits, **two** in a row is enough.) The other exception to fourth down is the broken sequence. When you have K J 10 x you should lead the J or the 10 depending on your partnership agreement. (More on this at a later lesson.)

If the bulk of the defensive points are held by your partner, you will not have enough to set up your own long suit. Therefore you must guess which suit is your partner's suit and lead it. At no trump contracts, the first to the goal wins. You don't have time to see the dummy before making a defensive lead.

Your short suit is most likely your partner's long suit because the declarer and his partner have not made any long suit bids. Prefer majors over minors because dummy with a four card major will often bid Stayman.

When the defensive points are evenly divided between you and your partner, you must make a lead that does not give anything away. In this case the key to the declarer's success may be a finesse. If you under lead a queen or four to a jack, you may give declarer his contract. If you lead to your partner, you may send his queen or king to the declarer's tenace. Give the declarer a trick that he will always get by making a "top of nothing" lead in a three or four card suit.

AGAINST 6 NO TRUMP CONTRACTS

The same principles apply to slam contracts except that we expect declarer to have 33 points between both sides. This leaves 7 for you and partner. If you have zero or 1 then try to find partner's suit. If you have 5-7 make your aggressive lead. In most cases you have 3 or 4 points. In this case you must not give anything away. Make a lead that declarer will always win and wait for him to make a losing finesse. Don't lead an unsupported Ace against a no trump slam contract unless the bidding has shown declarer or dummy with a "Source of Tricks" (SOT). This is a long solid suit on which declarer can throw away his losers. In the 1N - 6N bid, no SOT has been indicated. If you play the unsupported Ace of declarer or dummy's suit, you will set up the suit so that he has no problem making his contract. "Lie in wait" and watch partner's carding so that you know which suit to lead when you ultimately win with the ace.
