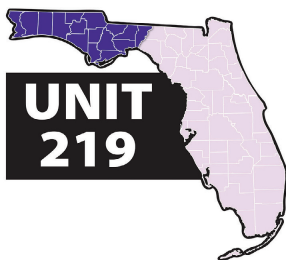

# Bridge in the Panhandle

This month, I have a pair of stories for you.

But first, the news: Tallahassee DBC has two new Life Masters: Becky Overton and Judy Parker. Mary Ann Abrams of Pensacola achieved Bronze Life Master status, as did William McCarron of Tallahassee. Doris Needham of Navarre and Sue Smith of Pace earned Silver LM. Congratulations to all!

On the charity front, Pensacola hosted their annual Heart Association charity game in honor of Floyd Lemox on February 14. (Floyd obtained the loan which allowed the club to purchase its own clubhouse in 1985.) Panama City held their 4th Annual Fund Raiser for the American Cancer Society, raising \$1,000. Thanks to all who participated. Now, on to stories...

Story #1 is about Pensacola DBC's newly-elected President, Alexa Canady-Davis. Did you know that she was the first female African-American neurosurgeon in the U.S.?

Raised in Lansing, Michigan, Alexa went to the University of Michigan, intending to major in mathematics. Not feeling the passion of her colleagues, she spent some time "playing" on the debate team and as editorial writer for a newspaper. Then she heard about a summer

clerkship available to minority students interested in entering the medical field. She had her eye on a \$1900 used car, so she took the 9-5 paid job.

Working in a cytogenetics lab, she studied human chromosomes alongside Dr. Arthur Bloom, who worked on a long-term study of progressive chromosome damage in survivors of Hiroshima. Alexa fell in love with medicine and went back to school with a new goal.

She went to medical school at Univ. of Michigan, and she was especially fascinated by everything "neuro." She shadowed a neurologist for one month, and then a neurosurgeon for another month. Of the two, she preferred Neurosurgery. She began her surgical training at Yale, and continued with her residency in Neurosurgery in Minnesota, followed by a Fellowship in Pediatric Neurosurgery in Philadelphia.

She began her practice in Detroit, at the Henry Ford Hospital, and then at the Children's Hospital, where she became the chair of the largest neurosurgery service in Michigan.

She met George Davis along the way, and they were married in 1988. He was still in the Navy, and was stationed in Dallas TX and then Guam, so for three years they lived apart. Finally, he moved to Detroit, with the understanding that when she retired, they would move to Pensacola.

And so they moved to Pensacola. Alexa attended some medical meetings, where her background was discovered. She was asked to fill the gap - there were no neurosurgeons in Pensacola at the time - and she graciously agreed to do so for the next eight years. By the time she retired (AGAIN!!), she had built up the program to include five neurosurgeons.

So how does bridge fit into all of this? She started to play "regular" bridge with some women friends in Detroit. Long after moving to Pensacola, she saw a sign outside the duplicate club, and signed up for lessons. Of course, she got hooked!

When you get to know Alexa, you can understand the connection for her between duplicate bridge and pediatric neurosurgery. Kids, even the kids who are sick enough to require neurosurgery, like to play. And Alexa liked to play with them. This is a perfectly valid form of medical evaluation. Adults don't always go along with this; kids do. Alexa's willingness and desire to play put kids and parents at ease.

Alexa does not want to be adored by the public; in fact, she is sort of shy. But yes, oh yes, she likes to play!

Story #2 comes from Fort Walton. You know how it is: Occasionally, a bridge hand comes along that you remember well. More rarely, a hand comes along that other people – even people who never played the hand – remember for you, and remind you about, and call you names about. Names like “Sticky Fingers” or “Houdini.”

Two men at the Fort Walton DBC had such an infamous hand recently.

Larry Fine, sitting North, picked up a whopper: ♠AKJ10, ♥—, ♦AKJ10x, ♣KQx. Naturally, he opened 2♣. With the opponents passing, the bidding continued with South (Ray Thomas) bidding 2♦. Larry re-bid 3♦. Ray, holding the ♠Q and the ♦Q, went fishing with 4 NT. Larry answered 5♦, showing three key cards, and Ray finished with a daring bid of 6♦.

West, holding two aces, then doubled and led the ♣A. Noting the ♥ void on the board, West then switched to a ♠. Declarer won that trick, drew trumps and claimed – showing that he had all the top Spades, the rest of the trumps and the top Clubs along with the Heart Void.

Everyone agreed on the result. Until later. The hand record, studied by a third party that night, revealed the fact that North had started with the singleton ♥K; this card apparently stuck in perfect alignment with another card in Larry’s hand.

And so, Larry got kidded about being Houdini. Lots of laughs later, the question remains: How many experienced bridge players does it take to count to thirteen?

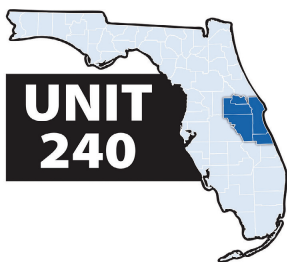

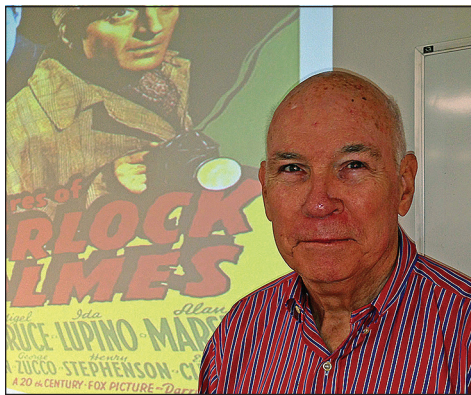


## Sherlock Holmes as Declarer

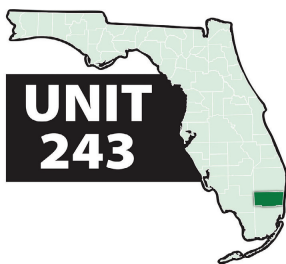

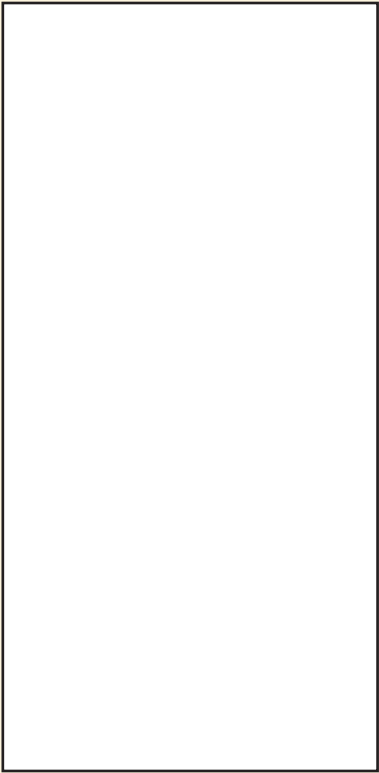
